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THE CHURCH YEAR

All Saints Day

In the church, the **liturgical year** focuses on the life and ministry of Jesus. The changing seasons of the church year provide an opportunity to celebrate the Christian faith in worship. The seasons are Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, and Pentecost.

The **sixth season** of the church year is **Pentecost**. It is the longest season of the church year, lasting approximately six months. It begins on the 50th day after Easter (the word “pentecost” is derived from the Greek, meaning “fiftieth”) and ends on the Saturday before the First Sunday in Advent.

Today is *All Saints Day*, which we celebrate every year on the first Sunday in November. On this day, we remember and thank God for all the saints of the church in every time and in every place. Reformation churches define saints to be *all believers* in Jesus Christ, both living and dead. We become saints through faith in Jesus and through Holy Baptism.

The changing **liturgical colors** in the sanctuary serve to adorn the worship space and call attention to the nature of the season or festival being celebrated. The liturgical color for All Saints is white, a festive color of light and joy.
