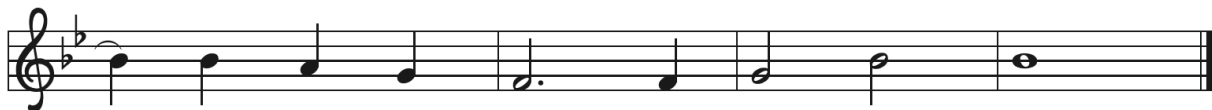

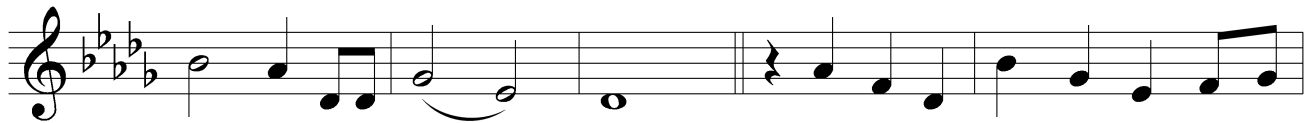

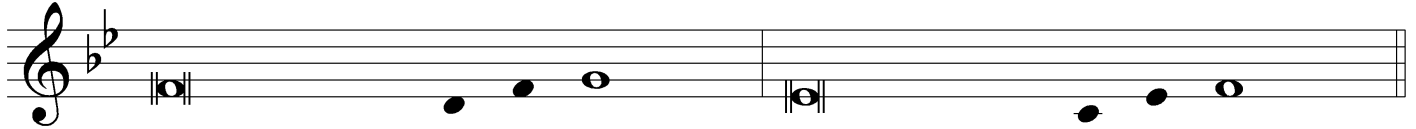

2 Timothy 3:14--4:5

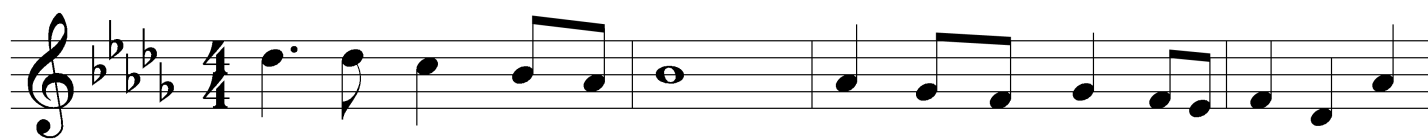
