THE CHURCH YEAR

The Season of Advent



In the church, the liturgical year focuses on the life and ministry of Jesus. The changing seasons of the church year provide an opportunity to celebrate the Christian faith in worship. The six seasons are Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, and Pentecost.

Advent is the season that marks the beginning of the Church Year. It begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas Day and ends the day before Christmas.

The word Advent means “coming” or “arrival.” The focus of the season is the celebration of the birth of Jesus and the anticipation of his return. Advent celebrates the revelation of God in Christ Jesus by which all creation is reconciled to God.

Advent is not the beginning of the Christmas season. Rather, it is a time of preparation. Advent is marked by the spirit of expectation, anticipation, preparation, and longing.

The changing liturgical colors in the sanctuary serve to adorn the worship space and to call attention to the nature of the season or festival being celebrated. The liturgical color for Advent is blue, which symbolizes hope and anticipation.

Blues and purples, the colors of Advent, represent a time of expectancy and preparation. During this season, as the light of day diminishes and the indigo night expands, we light the candles to counter the darkness, to illuminate the path, to prepare the way for the promised coming of the Light of the World.
