Following an ancient practice called *Lectio continua* (Latin for continuous reading), throughout July and August our second reading in worship each week is from Paul's letter to the Ephesians. The selections of scripture start in the first chapter and move in order through the sixth chapter, skipping some verses with the hope that the congregation reads the verses in between the appointed worship readings.

Our liturgy, hymnody and sermons during these seven weeks will all be connected to our worship readings from Ephesians. The readings and discussion questions can be found in a booklet in the narthex or online on our website, princeofpeacedublin.org.
