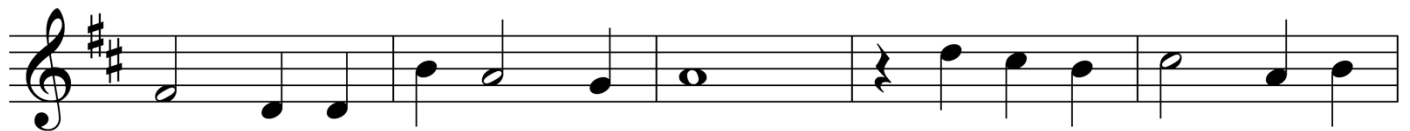

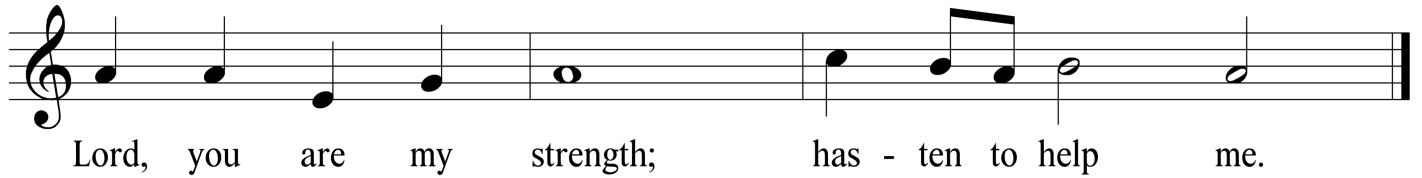

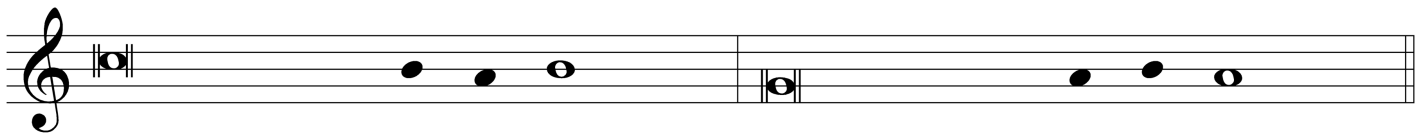

James 3:13—4:3, 7-8a

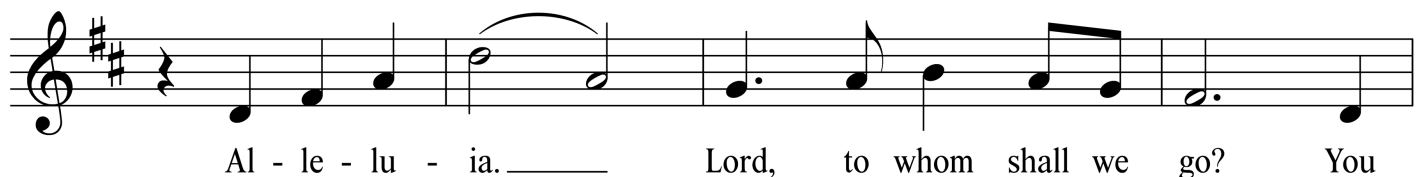
