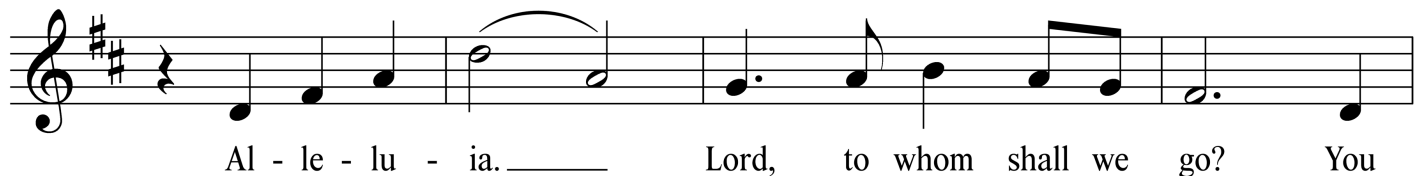
Hebrews 9:24-28
