# THE CHURCH YEAR

## *The Season of Easter*



In the church, the **liturgical year** focuses on the life and ministry of Jesus. The changing seasons of the church year provide an opportunity to celebrate the Christian faith in worship. The six seasons are Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter and Pentecost.

The **fifth season** of the church year is Easter. It is a fifty-day season that commemorates Christ's Resurrection from the dead and lasts until Pentecost Sunday. Because the foundation of our Christian faith is the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, Easter is the principal celebration of the liturgical year.

The date of Easter Sunday is not fixed but determined by a system based on a lunar calendar adapted from a formula decided by the Council of Nicaea in AD 325. The date of Easter can range between March 22 and April 25 depending upon the lunar cycle.

The changing liturgical colors in the sanctuary serve to adorn the worship space and to call attention to the nature of the season or festival being celebrated. The liturgical colors for the Easter season are **white and gold**, symbolizing the hope of the resurrection and the exaltation of Jesus as Lord and King.





### FIRST LESSON

Acts 11:1-18

<sup>1</sup> Now the apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God. <sup>2</sup> So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him, <sup>3</sup> saying, “Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?” <sup>4</sup> Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, <sup>5</sup> “I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners; and it came close to me. <sup>6</sup> As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. <sup>7</sup> I also heard a voice saying to me, ‘Get up, Peter; kill and eat.’ <sup>8</sup> But I replied, ‘By no means, Lord; for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth.’ <sup>9</sup> But a second time the voice answered from heaven, ‘What God has made clean, you must not call profane.’ <sup>10</sup> This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. <sup>11</sup> At that very moment

three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. <sup>12</sup>The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. <sup>13</sup>He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, 'Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; <sup>14</sup>he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved.' <sup>15</sup>And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. <sup>16</sup>And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, 'John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' <sup>17</sup>If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?" <sup>18</sup>When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, "Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life."

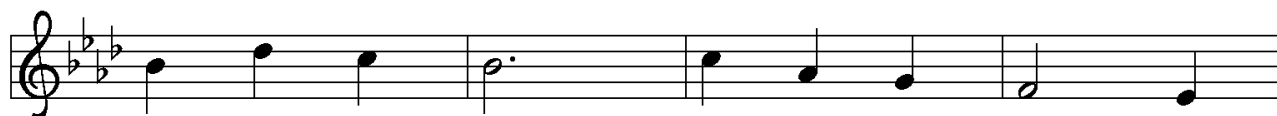

## PRESENTATION

Presider: Dear friends, we give thanks to God for the gift of baptism and for these people, one with us in the body of Christ, who are making public affirmation of their baptism:

Presider: Let us pray. Merciful God, we thank you for these sisters and brothers, whom you have made your own by water and the Word in baptism. You have called them to yourself, enlightened them with the gifts of your Spirit, and nourished them in the community of faith. Uphold your servants in the gifts and promises of baptism, and unite the hearts of all whom you have brought to new birth. We ask this in the name of Christ.

**All: Amen.**

## PROFESSION OF FAITH

Presider: I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.

Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God?

Confirmands: I renounce them.

Presider: Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God?

Confirmands: I renounce them.

Presider: Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God?

Confirmands: I renounce them.

Presider: Do you believe in God the Father?

Confirmands: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Presider: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

Confirmands: I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord,  
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,  
born of the virgin Mary,  
suffered under Pontius Pilate,  
was crucified, died, and was buried;  
he descended to the dead.  
On the third day he rose again;  
he ascended into heaven,  
he is seated at the right hand of the Father,  
and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Presider: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

Confirmands: I believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the holy catholic church,  
the communion of saints,  
the forgiveness of sins,  
the ✠ resurrection of the body,  
and the life everlasting.

Presider: You have made public profession of your faith. Do you intend to  
continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism:  
to live among God's faithful people,  
to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper,  
to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,  
to serve all people, following the example of Jesus,  
and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

Each Confirmand responds individually:

I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

Presider: People of God, do you promise to support these sisters and brothers and pray for them in their life in Christ?

**All:** **We do.**

Presider: Let us pray.

Gracious Lord, through water and the Spirit you have made these young people your own. You forgive them all their sins and bring them to newness of life. Continue to strengthen them with the Holy Spirit, and daily increase in them the gifts of your grace: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, and the spirit of joy in your presence; through Jesus Christ your Son, our Savior and Lord.
