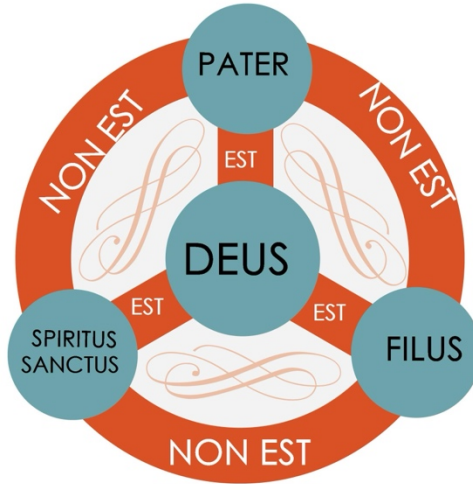

THE CHURCH YEAR

Holy Trinity



In the church, the liturgical year focuses on the life and ministry of Jesus. The changing seasons of the church year provide an opportunity to celebrate the Christian faith in worship. The seasons are Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, and Pentecost.

The sixth season of the church year is Pentecost. Today is Holy Trinity Sunday, the first Sunday After Pentecost. On this day, the church celebrates the mystery that God is triune (three-in-one), Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. By the power of the Holy Spirit, Christians accept this mystery as a fundamental article of faith.

The changing liturgical colors in the sanctuary serve to adorn the worship space and to call attention to the nature of the season or festival being celebrated. The liturgical color for Holy Trinity Sunday is white, symbolizing the holiness and perfection of God.
