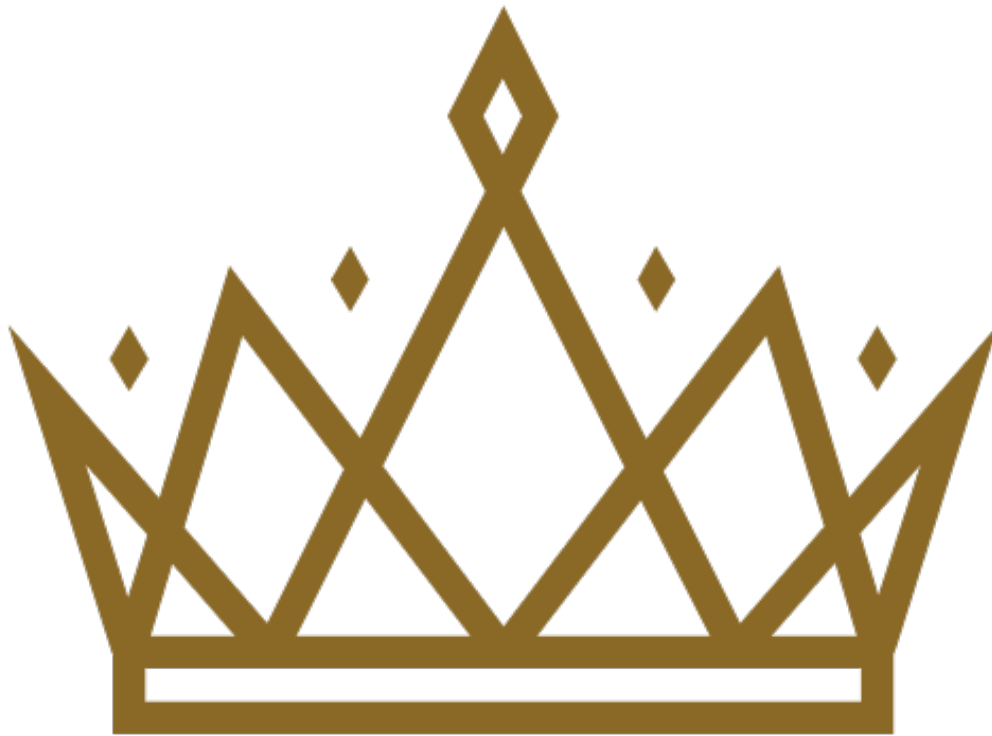

THE CHURCH YEAR

CHRIST THE KING SUNDAY



In the church, the liturgical year focuses on the life and ministry of Jesus. The changing seasons of the church year provide an opportunity to celebrate the Christian faith in worship. The seasons are Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, and Pentecost.

This weekend we celebrate Christ the King Sunday. It is the last Sunday of the church year and completes the Christian journey through the life of Jesus Christ on earth and in heaven, which began with the preparation for his birth during Advent last year.

One way kings obtain power is by raising and leading armies into war against other countries. Jesus' war was not against people or against a country, but against sin, death, and the power of the Devil. By his death, resurrection, and ascension, Jesus won the war against sin.

The liturgical color for the day is white, a festive color of light, joy and the celebration of our Lord.
